

For Oakland County, call 248-464-6363. Please be aware that only Community Living Services (CLS) in Oakland County will approve individuals to attend our program.

Once that is set up, tell them you would like to go to the RSA Foundation for skill building. Your student will need 22 units per day they with to attend our program.

## **Nancy Forster**

Nancy was able to interact and teach my student in their unknown environment."

## **Maria Maples**

"Maria is an amiable teacher, she is good at communicating with parents, my student's performance in school, what is good and what is not good, She communicates with us in a timely manner, she also communicates in many ways, sometimes in the school meets, sometimes in meetings, and sometimes sends emails. Her communication allows us to keep abreast of the performance of the students, which helps students correct their deficiencies and give full play to their strengths."

"She will encourage my student to do more things; she also trains my student to obey instructions in many ways, such as the proporation of reminders."

"Through training, she has improved my student's ability and established the self-confidence for my student. To deal with my student's shortcomings, she always communicates with my student alone to protect and increase my student's self-esteem,"

"Under the training, my student likes team activities very much, and also improves his desire to communicate. As a team member, my student's communication ability has been enhanced, and they have made a progress for cooperation with teacher and classmates."
