# From the Superintendent

Welcome to the new school year! We are happy to see all the smiling faces that have returned as well as the smiling (yet a bit apprehensive) faces of our new students. All are finding their way around, socializing and genuinely eager to learn and explore new opportunities.

Staff spent the week before school started learning so that they can bring some of the latest and greatest programs to your adult student. One day the entire staff attended leadership training at Base Camp in Genesee County. Staff were taken out of their comfort zone and challenged with activities that will help them grow together. Some staff were apprehensive about climbing the high ropes; however, they did amazingly well, tested their strength, and gained an understanding of what our students may go through when they are faced with something new. During the school year, it is our hope to have students attend Base Camp to challenge themselves to step out of their comfort zone and grow.

Another staff training was Virtual Thinking Strategies (VTS) at the DIA. Staff learned how to direct conversation to create deeper thinking for our students. VTS is hopefully something your student will talk to you about when they reflect upon their day. We are starting these strategies with artwork; however, we will move into social emotional learning as well as any other programs that we offer.
