




















Heidelberg Project - CBI

Autism Facts:

Per CDC, 1 in 36 children are diagnosed with autism.

Boys are 4x more likely to be diagnosed than girls.

31% of those with Autism Spectrum Disorder have an intellectual disability.

No medical test to detect autism.

Can be reliably diagnosed at age 2; however, many are not diagnosed until after 4.

Early intervention is the best opportunity to support development.

Ms. Maureen's class visited Planet Fitness where students experienced how their therapeutic massage units and exercise on various equipment release healthy chemicals. They also visited "9 Round Kickboxing" where the owner, Matt, taught students how practicing on timed stations with cardioboxing defuses anxiety, frustration, and releases healthy chemicals as well as builds stamina, strength, and conditioning. We studied the basics of Neurochemistry and how to activate "feel good" chemicals (serotonin, dopamine, oxytocin, enkephalins).
