Highlights: Job skills included a wide variety of experiences and lessons.

Students tapped into creativity as well as measuring potential consumer demand for hand crafted aromatherapy infused Shower Bombs, Sugar Scrubs and cereal infused Bird Feeders by placing products in the school store which are currently for sale!

Learning was followed by role playing how to make a good first impression for a job interview as well as socially.

Life skills: students learned about and role played how to make appointments and the acceptable and non acceptable reasons for calling an absence into work. Looking one's best for a job interview and working at a job included a life skill of learning how to mend a hole in a garment as well as replace a missing button.

A budgeting lesson using the basic "envelope" system helped the students learn about balancing needs and wants with money management.

Visiting the Maybelle Burnette library gave the students opportunity to do research on Black History Month and helped the students learn about the variety of resources the library has to offer as well as it is a cool place to read!

Social- emotional skills included visiting RSA's coffee shop, Gather + Grounds, trying their signature Lavender Lemonade while chatting and playing games in the fun and relaxing coffee house!





Ask The Advocate is a training series to help families and caregivers to prepare for the future of their loved ones who have disabilities. The topics covered will help you better navigate through the Special Education and Community Mental Health systems, help you to prepare financially while preserving government benefits, and give you the information you'll need to plan for your loved one's future goals.

Sep 12th	Supported Decision Making	Topics covered include person-centered planning, Power of Attorney, Patient Advocates, and Guardianship
Oct 10th	Creative Housing Options	Learn about the variety of ways to support individuals to lead a healthy life in a home of their choosing.
Nov 14th	Special Education Services	Hear representatives from Michigan Alliance for Families discuss skills that parents can use to become more effective advocates for your child with a disability.
Jan 9th	Navigating Medicaid Supports	Topics covered include how to apply for Medicaid and other benefits through Department of Health and Human Services, what Medicaid covers and how to access those services.
Feb 13th	Social Security Benefits	Topics covered include SSDI and SSI Benefits, qualification for benefits, and what is needed to apply

For Oakland County, call 248-464-6363. Please be aware that only Community Living Services (CLS) in Oakland County will approve individuals to attend our program.

Once that is set up, tell them you would like to go to the RSA Foundation for skill building. Your student will need 22 units per day they wish to attend our program.



The intake staffing consists of the support coordinator, program staff, the applicant and referring party. At the intake meeting, the applicant will receive an overview of the H.O.M.E. Hub program and expectations.
