

Rising Stars helps developmentally disabled hone life skills

Gather + Grounds offers social skills development, work experience





In the 1967 classic film "To Sir With Love" teacher Mark Thackeray nixes textbooks and begins teaching his students life skills.

Rising Stars Academy founders Deborah and Mark Prentiss are using that same philosophy for their charter school and foundation that teaches work, life and social skills to intellectually and developmentally disabled students.

The Rising Star Academy charter school, located in Center LIne, has 110 students between the ages of 18 and 26 years old; the Rising Star Home Hub community mental health skill building program for people who are ineligible for the academy because they have a high school diploma or are over 26 years old has 90 clients.

"We do teach money math because that is something they need to know – how to make change and things like that," Deborah Prentiss said. "But we are really teaching job skills."

The school has a 2.5 acre garden and small orchard complete with chickens where students can learn about agriculture. There are opportunities to get hands-on experience with culinary arts, light carpentry, flower arranging, aquaponics, crafts and more.

"We have our retail store, which is being reworked right now, where we sell popcorn, goods made at the school bakery and artwork and crafts made by the students," Prentiss said. "Sometimes we make jellies and things like that too that we sell."

Just a mile away from the campus, Gather + Grounds coffee bistro on Van Dyke Avenue in Center Line gives Rising Star students the chance to take their skills outside of the school building. The opportunity to develop social skills is equally as important — if not more so — than putting culinary skills to work.

"The hardest thing to teach these kids, which is why we developed Gather + Grounds, is social skills," said Prentiss. "You can teach them a skill and they will do it day in and day out because they're good at it, but they do not understand the social part of work."


There are internal jobs for students including food production, cleaning, and clerical work in the school's front office. Rising Stars also places students at remote job sites including Freedom Hill and various local restaurants.

The Donald Campbell Bakery within the school supplies bread and pastry products to many establishments including Green Dot Stables in Detroit, Comerica Park, Little Caesars Arena, Matt & Mo's Italian Beef in Hazel Park, Brown Iron Brewhouse in Royal Oak and The Godfrey Detroit hotel in Detroit.

On a typical afternoon, culinary students might be baking slider buns for Green



Deborah and Mark Prentiss previously taught in the Warren Consolidated Schools district and started Rising Stars because they believed there was a void that needed to be filled.

"The state refers to us as an anomaly because there is no one quite like us," said Prentiss. "We do what we do."

Rising Stars Academy opened in 2013; Gather + Grounds opened in April of 2024 and is open Monday – Friday from 7 a.m. – 4 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. – noon.

Ask The Advocate is a training series to help families and caregivers to prepare for the future of their loved ones who have disabilities. The topics covered will help you better navigate through the Special Education and Community Mental Health systems, help you to prepare financially while preserving government benefits, and give you the information you'll need to plan for your loved ones future goals.

Sep 12th	Supported Decision Making	Topics covered include person-centered planning, Power of Attorney, Patient Advocates, and Guardianship		
Oct 10th	Creative Housing Options	Learn about the variety of ways to support individuals to lead a healthy life in a home of their choosing.		
Nov 14th	Special Education Services	Topics covered will include Dispute Resolution		
Jan 9th	Navigating Medicaid Supports	Topics covered include how to apply for Medicaid and other benefits through Department of Health and Human Services, what Medicaid covers and how to access those services.



If your student is interested in attending Home Hub during the summer as well as when the Academy is closed, please contact Mr. Ryan Moir at 586-806-6455 or 248-508-1651 (cell). Below is information regarding the process. Please note that a supports coordinator is required.

For Macomb County, call Access Center if you do not already have a supports coordinator at 586-948-0222.

For Oakland County, call 248-464-6363. Please be aware that only Community Living Services (CLS) in Oakland County will approve individuals to attend our program.

Once that is set up, tell them you would like to go to the RSA Foundation for skill building. Your student will need 22 units per day they with to attend our program.

The intake staffing consists of the support coordinator, program staff, the applicant and referring party. At the intake meeting, the applicant will receive an overview of the H.O.M.E Hub program and expectations
